WOSC Race Programme 2024

General Handicap Series

Single start for all competitors. Race length approximately 45–60 minutes.

Singlehanded Series

Series for singlehanded boats, including two-handed boats sailing singlehanded with handicap adjustment. Singlehanded start before crewed fleet.

Crewed Series

Series for two or three-handed, or more (where allowed by class rules). Start after singlehanded fleet.

Fast Handicap Series

Series for all boats with a Portsmouth Number 1105 and faster (may change in March). Start before the slow fleet, includes Wayfarer and faster boats.

Slow Handicap Series

Series for boats with a Portsmouth Number above 1105 (may change in March). Start after the fast fleet, all boats slower than the Wayfarer.

Wednesday Evening Series 1 & 2

Wednesdays from April to September inclusive Start time: April, Aug & Sept 19:00, May—July 19:15 Race type: Evening 1, Fast and Slow Handicap, one start. Evening 2, Singlehanded and Crewed, one start. Both are combined for the General Handicap Evening Paddle Prizes.

A popular series in the summer months, well attended and hotly contested. Bar open after racing.

Easter Egg Races

Date: Sunday 31 March Easter egg hunt at 11:00 Start time: 12:00

Race type: General Handicap



WOSC OPEN WATER SWIMMING RULES

- Competent swimmers only. Each with a tow float and hi visibility swim hat. Any junior (U18) swimmers must have close 1:1 supervision by a competent adult buddy swimmer or rescue craft on the water with them at all times.
- Two person minimum at each swim session.
 Swimmers not more than 4m apart from nearest buddy with a responsible person available to initiate an emergency action plan.
- Rescue craft to be available to respond to swimmers in distress at all times when swimmers are in the water. The swimming safety kayak is on a combination padlock, (code 60380). Please ensure this is unlocked when you arrive to swim and then re-locked and secured when you have finished.
- Only paddle powered craft in the top swimming lake. These are to be kept out of the swim lane, unless being used for coaching or rescue purposes.
- 5. Swimmers to stay in identified safe swim track around the lake.
- Visual checks should be made of the lake before entering the water to ensure that weeds are not encroaching on swimming area.

- Entry into the water is at a set location only, please see marked signage at the lakeside.

We are introducing some changes to help you, including more flexibility around the RYA Sailing School courses and new Recreational Sailing sessions as well as continuing with the Starting racing at WOSC sessions, the Club races and the WOSC team racing squad for juniors. We've even made a diagram to show how all this fits together! See below for more details.

New! WOSC Recreational Sailing sessions

Members are always asking how they can practice their sailing with the reassurance of powerboat

cover. For 2024, WOSC is introducing Recreational Sailing sessions on Saturday afternoons throughout the summer with powerboat support. These sessions are not run by the sailing school, no instruction is provided and you don't need to register. It's just an opportunity for you to practice your sailing, have fun and maybe do some family sailing in the summer. However, because of other events, it's not every Saturday afternoon in the summer, and details of when these sessions are happening will be on the WOSC calendar. The committee are supporting this initiative by making club boats free to hire in these sessions you'll still need to remember sign boats out before going on the water and your sailing safety is your responsibility. Hire charges for boats at other times are as normal.

have Powerboat 2 (PB2) qualification or who are interested in gaining PB2 to sign up to a powerboat rota. This will count as one of your club duties. Look out for an email to sign up for powerboat duties and for PB2 training to support these new sessions.

Sailing School 2024

There are some changes happening to the Sailing School for 2024. These are aimed at providing the same amount of training for juniors and adults but in a more flexible way for students and instructors. See the WOSC calendar for course dates.

- RYA Youth Level 1, 2, and 3 courses:
 Each course will be run as two whole consecutive Saturdays (see timetable).

 Students will need to register for each course and will need to complete both Saturdays and will be issued with a certificate on successful completion.
- RYA Adult Level 1 and 2 courses: Previously you had to sign up to do both of these courses together. However, for 2024 you'll be able to sign up to Level 1 or 2 separately. As previously, these courses will each run over a weekend with full days on Saturday and Sunday.
- New for 2024: A Youth Stage 4 course and an Adult Level 3 course will be run in September. These 'better sailing' courses will consolidate your practice over the summer and get you ready for racing in the winter.
- Junior Sailing week: This will run as normal, on five afternoons in the summer holidays.
 See the calendar on the website for details.
- Powerboat 2: Become a qualified powerboat driver at WOSC; it's free to do the course but

- you need to sign up to the powerboat rota to support club racing and/or recreational sailing sessions.
- Powerboat refresher: The controls in the powerboats have been changed and we have a new dock, so everyone with a PB2 certificate should do a refresher course; these take a couple of hours – see the calendar for dates.

Membership of WOSC

The membership year runs from 1st March to the end of February and is limited to 350 memberships.

New members joining part way through the season are given a discount on membership fees.

Members. There are no paid posts within the club. The Club expects Members:

a) to abide by the Club Rules;

b) to assist with running the Club Racing (Sundays throughout the year and some Saturdays and Wednesday evenings during the Summer) when selected, on a rota basis, by the Sailing Secretary (Club Rule 22). For most club members, you should expect to do a minimum of 1 or 2 duties per year although it will occur more frequently for regular racing members. Other duties can be substituted as on page 21.

- Enjoy the availability to sail 365 days a year.
- Use of the club facilities to change and shower.
- Sail the club boats: Wayfarer, Firefly, Laser, H12, Topper (hire charge applies for recreational sailing, there is no charge for use of club boats for club racing).
- For children, sail the club Optimists (free).
- Adult & Junior sail training free to members' children aged 8–18.
- Saturday afternoon adult & junior sailing for children over 8 years (May, June, July, Aug, Sept).
- August Junior sailing week (numbers limited, booking required).
- Junior Team race training incl. matches and competitions.
- General handicap racing on Wednesday evenings (summer only) and Sundays.
- Special racing events on selected weekends.
- Weekend sailing courses.
- Dinghy storage (annual fee applies).
- Swim in the swimming area and open water swimming lake.
- Social events (Quiz nights, Halloween, Bonfire night and more...).
- Barbecue on the club facilities.
- · Picnic and relax on the grass area.
- Above all enjoy a convivial and friendly atmosphere.



Are there any restrictions when I can use the Club and how do I get into the Club outside of normal opening times?

NO – As a member you will be provided with one free swipe card which allows unlimited access through the front gate and the Clubhouse. Family members may purchase a second swipe card.

Security – Security of the premises and Clubhouse is paramount, you must close the gate behind you to keep the club safe and secure and freely available for members to use. The gate into WOSC should be closed and locked behind you at all times. You should not allow anyone to follow you in without checking they are a member. Similarly, the Clubhouse door should be shut at all times

On leaving the Club premises it is paramount that you ensure the Clubhouse is totally secure, garage door, patio door and main door and the main gate is closed and the electric lock engaged.

Safety – Outside of normal sailing and scheduled events and activities the Club does not have a patrol boat on the water to render assistance. You are therefore sailing at your own risk.

Do I have to do Club duties and what do they entail?

YES – The Club is run by the members and everyone must take part in Club duties. There are two types of duties – Race and Galley. Duties

are undertaken by Adults and Families but only 1 adult member of a family is on the roster.

Race Duty – This is rostered on Wednesday
Evenings (April to September inclusive) some
Saturdays for special events such as open
meetings and Sundays all year round. This
includes Officer of the Day (OOD) who sets the
racing course, Patrol Boat driver (if qualified)
and Assistant Officer of the Day (AOD). Typically
on Wednesday evening for the single race you
are required to be at the Club from 6.30pm and
usually finished by 8.45pm. April to September
Sundays from 11:15 to 16:45 for the three races
and in the winter, two races from 10:45 to 15:30.

Galley Duty — Sunday and occasional Saturdays. Many non-sailors opt for galley duty which involves providing lunch (ready to eat around 13:00, 12:30 in winter) and afternoon tea (around 15:00, not required in winter). There are periods in the year when lunch is not provided on a Sunday. You decide what you will provide (guidance available), buy the ingredients, prepare, cook and serve charging normally £4.00 for lunch. The income should cover the costs with a small surplus. You will not be out of pocket.

What if I can't do my duty?

Duties are published well in advance on the website and in the Newsletter. If you are not available on your assigned date you are required to telephone other members to arrange a swap. Contact phone numbers are published on the duty roster. If you change duties you must inform Caroline Hollier for Race Duty (caroline.key@adrianhollier.co.uk) or Stig Topp-Jorgenson for Galley Duty (galley@wosc.org.uk).

Can I bring my own dinghy to the Club?

YES – Use of boats on Club premises is limited to canoes, kayaks, paddle boards, rowing boats

and single hulled sailing dinghies less than 5.0 metres in length or having a Portsmouth Number (PN) greater than 940, PN being defined by the RYA. Only boats with a PN of 940 or greater are eligible to race.

How do I locate a berth for my dinghy(s), kayaks or canoes?

Once you have paid your berth fee to locate a berth you should contact the Harbourmaster at harbourmaster@wosc.org.uk. Berths are large enough for the storage of one sailing dinghy, for the storage of canoes and kayaks a rack is provided on the bund.

Do I need to pay for a berth for my kayaks or canoes?

YES – If you do not store your kayak or canoe with your dinghy you must purchase a berth. If you have multiple kayaks or canoes you may need to purchase more than one berth.

Do I need dinghy/kayak/canoe/rowing boat insurance?

YES – Every member who uses or keeps one of the above on the Club's property must be covered by insurance against third party liability to an amount as shown on a current application (£1 million) or renewal form to cover any one accident. All members on initial application and on renewal shall be required to sign to say that such insurance is in place.

Are Club boats insured?

YES – The General Committee ensures that all boats owned by the Club and made available for use by members or participants in RYA sailing courses organized at the Club are covered by equivalent insurance.

How do I hire a Club dinghy?

Boats can **only** be hired by **club members** and must **not be sailed in wind above force 4**, except at the discretion of a Committee member. The fees are used for the maintenance of the boats.

Boats are maintained at a level suitable for club racing boats should not be used as swimming/ diving platforms.

Boats shall be beached using the launching trolley, and sails must not be left hoisted whilst the boat is not being sailed. Cover must be replaced and the boat tied down.

To hire a Club Topper, Firefly, Wayfarer, H12, Laser you must first book the boat and pay the hire fee at the clubhouse or online through the website. Club Optimists are for use by children only are free to use. The Boat Hire Book is located in the main corridor on the shelf next to the visitors book. Record your hire of a boat in the Boat Hire Book and place your hire fee in one of the small brown envelopes provided. Pay the hire fee and importantly write the details of your name,

membership number and fee on the envelope. Once complete, place the envelope through the brass letter box in the bar store door located behind the bar. See table below.

Please consult a member of the General Committee if you want to use a Club boat for the first time.

Please do not beach or drag club boats on the shore, this damages the hull. Do use the launching trailers to take boats out of the water or ask others to assist you in lifting a boat. Do drop or furl the sails when not in use, do not leave the sails flapping. Do roll sails to avoid creasing them (ask for help if you don't know how to store sails). Please look after our boats!

Optimists: There are many Club Optimists and the sails, masts, rudder and dagger boards can be found in the garage. They are not dinghy specific so please use any. The Optimists are located in the compound to the left of the Club. A small trolley is provided to move it to the water. After use, return the dinghy to the compound and lock the gate.

Toppers: There are many Club Toppers and the sails, masts, rudder and dagger boards can be found in the garage. They are not dinghy specific so please use any. The Toppers are located on the rack to the left (away from the car park) of the Clubhouse. The Toppers can be launched from where they are stored.

Hartley H12: The H12 is the new generation of training boat, it is very stable, has a deep, roomy, comfortable cockpit, high boom, good head clearance and visibility, self-draining, easy reefed, easy to right—comes up with very little water. There are two H12s which are stored next to the Fireflies, all equipment is stored in the boats.

Fireflies: There are six Fireflies. Sails, masts, rudder and centre boards are in/on the dinghy. The Fireflies are stored on launching trolleys

and located alongside the lake to the left (away from the car park) of the Clubhouse. They can be launched from where they are stored.

Wayfarers: There are three Club Wayfarers and the sails, masts, rudder and centre boards are in/on the dinghy. They are located to the left (away from the car park) of the Clubhouse in front of the compound with the safety boats. They are stored on a launching trolley and can be launched from the slipway immediately in front of the Clubhouse. Once launched please return the launching trolley to the berth to leave access to the slipway free.

Lasers: There are two Club Lasers and the sails, masts, rudder and dagger boards are kept in the garage. They are located to the left (away from the car park) of the Clubhouse, one in the row alongside the lake and the second close to the container. They are stored on a launching trolley and can be launched from either slipway immediately in front of the Clubhouse.

Please leave the boats and equipment in the state that you would wish to find them. Please de-rig, return the rigs (if appropriate) to the garage, put the boat back and secure the cover (if appropriate).

What do I do if a piece of equipment is missing or breaks on a Club boat?

Alongside the hire Boat Hire Book is a book for boat repairs. Enter the necessary details in the book and then taking a tag from the wall in front of you, attach this to the boat or equipment in need of repair. The boat maintenance crew will ensure it is repaired. If you do not record the repair no one knows and it cannot be repaired.

Do I need a buoyancy aid?

YES – Buoyancy aids are compulsory for all on paddle boards, windsurfers, canoes, kayaks, rowing boats or dinghies when on either lake.

May I swim?

YES – You can swim in the designated area in the large lake in front of the tables and swings. Children under 16 swimming must be supervised.

Can I swim in the main lake in front of the Clubhouse outside of the designated area?

 ${
m NO}$ – You can only swim in the designated area.

Can I use a boat in the swimming area?

NO – Hard hulled craft, boards, canoes etc. are not allowed in the swimming area. Inflatable boats or inflatable canoes are allowed.

Can I swim on the Open Water Course?

YES – The small top lake is for the sole use of open water swimmers and human powered paddle craft. No engine powered, other than for weed cutting, or sailing vessels may use this lake. As with other water sports any member undertaking the activity of open water swimming must understand the risks inherent in this activity and be medically fit and competent to undertake it.

- No solo swimming, minimum of two people who must stay within 4 metres of each other.
- Bright coloured swim hat and swimming drag along (tow) float to be used by all swimmers.
- · Only enter the water at the signed slipway.
- Mobile phone and safety kayak to be ready and available at the entry point.
- No swimming when under the influence of alcohol.
- Swimmers only enter the water and swim if it is within their capabilities.

Can I bring visitors to the Club?

YES – A member may invite not more than five persons which includes adults and children ("Guests") at any time to the Club premises. For the purpose of this rule, Family memberships count as one member. Members must sign their guests in by entering the names and addresses

of their guests in the visitor's book and must pay the fee as stated in the visitor's book. The member is personally responsible for their guest(s) whilst they are on Club premises. A member may not invite any person who has been refused or expelled from membership without the prior consent of the General Committee

The maximum number of times that any one guest may visit the Club premises in any calendar year is three (3). A member wishing to invite more than five persons to the Club premises (Rule 64) or exceed the maximum numbers of visits per year (Rule 65) must request and receive the prior consent of the General Committee

Can I use a BBQ at the Club?

YES – You can use the Club provided fixed BBQ located under the canopy on the decking. Charcoal and lighters are not provided by the Club. You must clean up after use and dispose of the ash. Do not place hot ash in the bins. If you bring a disposable BBQ and use it on the grass area you must ensure it is raised clear of the grass to avoid a grass burn.

Can I bring dogs to the Club?

YES – However, no dogs (with the exception of assistance dogs) are allowed in the Clubhouse or on the patio area. All dogs around the Clubhouse, on the grassed area in front of the car park or within the boat parks must be on a lead. If your dog "unburdens" itself please ensure you pick up. You may walk your dog around the lake off the lead once clear of the Clubhouse, car and boat parks.

Safety and Security at the Club

It is important to be aware of safety at the club, this not only protects you and your family but other people and their families. It is important to comply with the safety rules of the club to ensure our insurance remains valid.

Buoyancy Aids

Buoyancy aids are compulsory for all activities on the water, and covers both lakes. Activities include sailing, canoes, kayaks, paddle board rowing boats and using inflatables. Please wear one.

Barbecues

There is a fixed BBQ located under the canopy by the club house. Members are encouraged to use this. Please clean the BBQ after you have used it. Do not place hot ash in the bins. If you use a BBQ on the grassed area you must ensure it is raised to avoid burning the grass. During the summer the club may ban BBQ on the grass area due to the fire risk. Please ensure you find out if this is in force.

Gate Security

To keep the club safe and secure, please close the gate behind you every time you use it. You should not let anyone in without checking if they are members.

At the end of the day, the goals are simple: Safety and security.

Medical Information

In the event of a medical emergency, knowledge of the casualty's relevant medical history and current medication might be of significant importance to those providing first responder care as well as to paramedics called to assist and to hospital staff should hospital transfer be necessary.

The club would encourage everyone to complete the outside of the medical information envelopes even if they write "no relevant information" on the form inside, so that the club knows "who to contact in case of emergency". This form is an

invitation to make more information available. It is not compulsory, and if you would rather not complete the form that is entirely up to you.

Completed forms will be held in individual sealed envelopes in a place designated for the secure keeping of confidential information and will be accessible at all times in the event of a medical emergency. Blanks are kept in the storage box (to be kept by the first aid box and defibrillator) in the clubbouse

At the time of annual renewal of membership, members will be reminded that those who have completed a medical information form should consider whether it needs to be updated. However, it is the responsibility of the member completing this form to keep their information up to date, promptly and without waiting for the annual reminder

There is no need to record medical events which can be of no significance in an emergency situation.

Examples:

- Atrial fibrillation (irregular heart beat) started on anticoagulants (blood thinners) – relevant
- Benign skin cancer removed irrelevant

Members are encouraged to provide a copy of a recent hospital discharge or clinic letter, if applicable, if this lists relevant medical problems and current medication. It will give the hospital personal identification number for the individual making it easier for hospital staff to find hospital notes on admission. Hospital letters may be placed in the sealed envelope with this form, and need not be copied onto the form. Medical terminology will be understood by paramedics and by some members of the club, such as those who have medical, nursing, paramedic or pharmaceutical training.
