Crewed Series

Series for two or three-handed, or more (where allowed by class rules). Start after singlehanded fleet.

Fast Handicap Series

Series for all boats with a Portsmouth Number 1105 and faster (may change in March). Start before the slow fleet, includes Wayfarer and faster boats.

Slow Handicap Series

Series for boats with a Portsmouth Number above 1105 (may change in March). Start after the fast fleet, all boats slower than the Wayfarer.

Wednesday Evening Series 1 & 2

Wednesdays from April to August inclusive Start time: April & Aug 19:00 May—July 19:15 Race type: Evening 1, Fast and Slow Handicap, one start. Evening 2, Singlehanded and Crewed, one start. Both have General Handicap prizes too A popular series in the summer months, well attended and hotly contested. Bar open after racing.

West Oxfordshire Sailing Club has a well-established RYA-affiliated sailing school. All tuition is organised under the supervision of experienced volunteer RYA qualified Senior Instructors and participants can gain a nationally recognised certificate in sailing. In 2023, the WOSC Sailing School will continue to offer a range of courses for club members and external candidates. In addition to the regular training activity, we will be encouraging participants to continue their skill development by joining in with the "Start Racing at WOSC" club dinghy racing — see the WOSC Race

Please keep yourselves up to date with events through the WOSC website and when required course registrants will be contacted directly should courses be subject to change.

Pre-requirements and Equipment

Programme for 2023.

For the sailing courses, you must be able to swim 50 metres in light clothing; you will not be tested on this, but you are expected to be confident enough in water, wearing a buoyancy aid, and to participate in the capsize drill.

- Please wear suitable clothing for the weather and assume that you will get wet, so bring a change of clothes.
- You must bring your own buoyancy aid for the Saturday Afternoon Training

Sessions and Junior Sailing Week.

- For the weekend course, buoyancy aids can be provided by the club if necessary.
- All participants must wear closed shoes that don't come off, i.e. no 'crocs', sandals or flip-flops. Old trainers or water/beach shoes are fine.
- You MUST declare any medical issues of relevance (see booking conditions) to the Training Secretary (training@wosc.org.uk) before participating in any training course at the time it is booked. Information on medical conditions will need to be passed on to Instructors so that they are better prepared to assist you should you be taken ill.
- If you have a medical condition that could potentially cause loss of consciousness or awareness, as well as informing the Training Secretary, you will need to use a life jacket that supports the head above the water, rather than a buoyancy aid.
- It would be helpful for Instructors if parents could discuss any special educational needs with the Training Secretary (training@wosc. org.uk) before participation in the course.

Sailing School Courses 1. Weekend RYA Sailing School Level 1 and 2 Course

Open to WOSC members and external candidates +16 years

The aim of this course is to teach a beginner to sail over two consecutive weekends achieving Level 1 and Level 2 RYA qualifications.

Times will be 9.30am to 5pm each day. There is a maximum of 9 students per course.

This course is recommended for those over 16 years of age, though the minimum age is

14 years, for example, if taken with a parent. All young people under 16 must be accompanied by their parent/guardian at all times.

All students will need to sign in at each session.

Course content

Level 1—On this course, we start with the assumption that you have never been in a sailing boat before and, by the end, you will be able to sail in light winds with an Instructor in the boat.

Level 2—By the end of this course, you will be safety conscious, have a basic knowledge of sailing and be capable of sailing, in light winds, without an Instructor on board

You will receive four full days of instruction. Both the syllabus elements and the duration of training contribute to certification.

The course is conducted mainly in Wayfarers, but there may be opportunities to sail in other boats depending on progress and weather conditions. The course is led by a Senior Instructor and the ratio of instructors:participants is normally 1:3 but may be up to 1:6.

External candidates

Booking is on a first come first served basis by contacting the training secretary: training@wosc.org.uk.

The cost of the course to external candidates is £250 in total (includes two weekends, Level 1 and Level 2), to be paid in full at the time of booking.

This amazing offer also includes temporary membership of the club until the following March, so that you can have access to club boats and facilities to further practice your sailing. Once your temporary membership expires, you can apply for full club membership if places are available.

Important note: You will be expected to comply with the conditions of membership which

includes club duties a couple of times a year (see Membership pages for more details).

WOSC members

Booking is on a first come first served basis booked via the events calendar on the website. This course attracts a £50 administration fee.

Certificates

On successful completion of the course, all qualifying candidates will receive RYA Level 1 and Level 2 certificates along with a logbook and 'Start Sailing' guide.

Cancellation conditions apply, see website.

2. Saturday Afternoon RYA Training for Adults and Juniors

Open to WOSC members only, aged 8+ years

This training is aimed at those that cannot commit to two consecutive weekends and would like to access training in a more flexible way as and when a student attends. Both adults and juniors of at least 8 years of age can take part.

All children under 16 years of age must have a parent/guardian at WOSC at all times who must sign in all children. All participants are required to sign in at every session.

Costs

Training is free, but contributions to the Martin Gibson Junior Sailing Fund are welcomed.

Course content

Adults will follow the Level 1 and 2 RYA syllabus and juniors the Youth Stage 1, 2 or 3 syllabus, depending on previous sailing experience. Those who already hold these qualifications can still take part in the training sessions.

You can attend as many or as few sessions as you want, but of course the more you attend the

faster your progress will be. Each session lasts approximately 3 hours depending on conditions.

Also, if you want to apply for RYA certificates, there is a minimum course duration for each Level of 8 hours of instruction

Start time is 13:00 and runs on till 16:00 or when the sun stops shining!

Please be prompt and be ready to sail at 13:00 otherwise you may not get a sail as the Instructors will have organised everyone and gone sailing!

The session is led by a Senior Instructor with the required minimum RYA instructor/participant ratios. Adults will usually be in a Wayfarer, Firefly, H12 or Laser. Children will be taught in Optimist, Topper, Firefly, H12, Laser and Wayfarer.

Booking

All students that wish to take part in ANY Saturday afternoon session need to book once at the beginning of the season. This allows us to track progress. To book, you must first log into the club website then go to events, find the event, click on 'register' and follow the instructions. Note that we must adhere to RYA Instructor: student ratios and safety boat: dinghy ratios so if the course is very busy groups may need to be rotated between boats and 'snack time'.

You will still need to sign in at the start of each session, otherwise your progress will not be logged.

Certification

All training will be logged and progress and attendance will be reviewed in September. Those students who have reached the required standards for RYA Level 1 or 2 or Youth Stage 1, 2 or 3 will be informed by the Training Secretary. If a student wishes to have a certificate, it can be issued at the cost of £20 administration fee (per level), but students are not obliged to apply for a certificate. As well as a certificate, students

will be provided with a log book and 'Start Sailing' book.

3. Junior Sailing Week

Open to WOSC members only, aged 8 to 18 years

This week is designed to accommodate the absolute beginner to those who wish to access club racing. There is a maximum of 44 places available. All young people under 16 must be accompanied by their parent/guardian at all times.

Course content

The RYA Youth Stage 1, 2 and 3 syllabus will be covered, depending on the students' abilities.

The course duration is 15-20 hours depending on conditions. As each level takes 8 hours, all three levels cannot be completed in the week, but skills acquired and hours of training undertaken can be added to those obtained by attendance at Saturday Afternoon RYA Training for Adults and Juniors.

The session is led by a Senior Instructor with the required minimum RYA instructor/participant ratios. Instructors will allocate groups based on previous sailing experience so students will not have to repeat Stages that they have already completed. The course will be conducted in Optimist, Topper, Firefly, Laser, H12 and Wayfarer.

Costs

The week is free, though donations to the Martin Gibson Junior Sailing Fund are welcomed.

Booking

Notifications of the booking procedure will be announced in the What's on at WOSC newsletter and added to the Juniors pages of the website. An e-mail notification will also be sent to all members. Please only apply if your child can attend the entire week.

Certification

Those that achieve the requirements for the Youth RYA Stage 1 and 2 or 3 syllabus can have a certificate issued at a cost of £20 (per level), but students are not obliged to apply for a certificate. As well as a certificate, students will be provided with a log book and 'Start Sailing' book.

4. Powerboat Level 2 Course

Open to WOSC members only aged 16+

To facilitate the Patrol Boat cover for club racing, a 2-day course resulting in a RYA Powerboat Level 2 qualification is offered. This is free to candidates with certificates issued at club cost. Students will be added to the Patrol Boat rota for club duties. You must be 16 years of age for this course. Courses will be advertised and registration will be through the events page. If you have any questions regarding this course, please contact the Training Secretary using the following e-mail address: training@wosc.org.uk.

5. Powerboat Direct Assessment

Open to WOSC members only aged 16+

Powerboat Direct Assessment is offered to those that feel they have the required competence to meet the requirements of the RYA level 2 syllabus. This will take a couple of hours to complete and is free to candidates. Certificates are issued at club cost. Students will be added to the Patrol Boat rota for club duties. You must be 16 years of age for this course.

RYA Training Qualifications

If you wish to train towards obtaining an RYA Instructor qualification, the committee has agreed to cover the financial burden of the required courses for each role when additional Instructors are required for the RYA Sailing School. For this we will also receive support from the RYA. To put this into context, the cost of becoming a Dinghy Instructor if an individual was

to attend a commercial training supplier would be around £600

Your Commitment to WOSC

Club members, as a minimum should expect to undertake one to two duties per year and as a new member your duty will be assistant race officer.

Members. There are no paid posts within the club. The Club expects Members:

a) to abide by the Club Rules;

b) to assist with running the Club Racing (Sundays throughout the year and some Saturdays and Wednesday evenings during the Summer) when selected, on a rota basis, by the Sailing Secretary (Club Rule 22). For most club members, you should expect to do a minimum of 1 or 2 duties per year although it will occur more frequently for regular racing members. Other duties can be substituted as on page 21.

- Enjoy the availability to sail 365 days a year.
- Use of the club facilities to change and shower.
- Sail the club boats: Wayfarer, Firefly, Laser, H12, Topper (hire charge applies for recreational sailing, there is no charge for use of club boats for club racing).
- For children, sail the club Optimists (free).
- Adult & Junior sail training free to members' children aged 8–18.
- Saturday afternoon adult & junior sailing for children over 8 years (May, June, July, Aug, Sept).
- August Junior sailing week (numbers limited, booking required).
- Junior Team race training incl. matches and competitions.
- General handicap racing on Wednesday evenings (summer only) and Sundays.
- Special racing events on selected weekends.
- · Weekend sailing courses.
- Dinghy storage (annual fee applies).
- Swim in the swimming area and open water swimming lake.
- Social events (Quiz nights, Halloween, Bonfire night and more...).
- Barbecue on the club facilities.
- · Picnic and relax on the grass area.
- Above all enjoy a convivial and friendly atmosphere.

USEFUL INFORMATION



Are there any restrictions when I can use the Club and how do I get into the Club outside of normal opening times?

NO – As a member you will be provided with one free swipe card which allows unlimited access through the front gate and the Clubhouse. Family members may purchase a second swipe card.

Security – Security of the premises and Clubhouse is paramount, you must close the gate behind you to keep the club safe and secure and freely available for members to use. The gate into WOSC should be closed and locked behind you at all times. You should not allow anyone to follow you in without checking they are a member. Similarly, the Clubhouse door should be shut at all times.

On leaving the Club premises it is paramount that you ensure the Clubhouse is totally secure, garage door, patio door and main door and the main gate is closed and the electric lock engaged.

Safety – Outside of normal sailing and scheduled events and activities the Club does not have a patrol boat on the water to render assistance. You are therefore sailing at your own risk.

Do I have to do Club duties and what do they entail?

YES – The Club is run by the members and everyone must take part in Club duties. There are two types of duties – Race and Galley. Duties

are undertaken by Adults and Families but only 1 adult member of a family is on the roster.

Race Duty – This is rostered on Wednesday
Evenings (April to September inclusive) some
Saturdays for special events such as open
meetings and Sundays all year round. This
includes Officer of the Day (OOD) who sets the
racing course, Patrol Boat driver (if qualified)
and Assistant Officer of the Day (AOD). Typically
on Wednesday evening for the single race you
are required to be at the Club from 6.30pm and
usually finished by 8.45pm. April to September
Sundays from 11:15 to 16:45 for the three races
and in the winter, two races from 10:45 to 15:30.

Galley Duty — Sunday and occasional Saturdays. Many non-sailors opt for galley duty which involves providing lunch (ready to eat around 13:00, 12:30 in winter) and afternoon tea (around 15:00, not required in winter). There are periods in the year when lunch is not provided on a Sunday. You decide what you will provide (guidance available), buy the ingredients, prepare, cook and serve charging normally £4.00 for lunch. The income should cover the costs with a small surplus. You will not be out of pocket.

What if I can't do my duty?

Duties are published well in advance on the website and in the Newsletter. If you are not available on your assigned date you are required to telephone other members to arrange a swap. Contact phone numbers are published on the duty roster. If you change duties you must inform Caroline Hollier for Race Duty (caroline.key@adrianhollier.co.uk) or Stig Topp-Jorgenson for Galley Duty (galley@wosc.org.uk).

Can I bring my own dinghy to the Club?

YES – Use of boats on Club premises is limited to canoes, kayaks, paddle boards, windsurfer

boards, rowing boats and single hulled sailing dinghies less than 5.0 metres in length or having a Portsmouth Number (PN) greater than 970, PN being defined by the RYA. Only boats with a PN of 1000 or greater are eligible to race.

How do I locate a berth for my dinghy(s), kayaks or canoes?

Once you have paid your berth fee to locate a berth you should contact the Harbourmaster at harbourmaster@wosc.org.uk. Berths are large enough for the storage of one sailing dinghy, for the storage of canoes and kayaks a rack is provided on the bund.

Do I need to pay for a berth for my kayaks or canoes?

YES – If you do not store your kayak or canoe with your dinghy you must purchase a berth. If you have multiple kayaks or canoes you may need to purchase more than one berth.

Do I need dinghy/kayak/canoe/rowing boat/ windsurfer insurance?

YES – Every member who uses or keeps one of the above on the Club's property must be covered by insurance against third party liability to an amount as shown on a current application (£1 million) or renewal form to cover any one accident. All members on initial application and on renewal shall be required to sign to say that such insurance is in place.

Are Club boats insured?

YES – The General Committee ensures that all boats owned by the Club and made available for use by members or participants in RYA sailing courses organized at the Club are covered by equivalent insurance.

How do I hire a Club dinghy?

Boats can **only** be hired by **club members** and must **not be sailed in wind above force 4**, except at the discretion of a Committee member. The fees are used for the maintenance of the boats.

Boats are maintained at a level suitable for club racing boats should not be used as swimming/ diving platforms.

Boats shall be beached using the launching trolley, and sails must not be left hoisted whilst the boat is not being sailed. Cover must be replaced and the boat tied down.

To hire a Club Topper, Firefly, Wayfarer, H12, Laser you must first book the boat and pay the hire fee at the clubhouse or online through the website. Club Optimists are for use by children only are free to use. The Boat Hire Book is located in the main corridor on the shelf next to the visitors book. Record your hire of a boat in the Boat Hire Book and place your hire fee in one of the small brown envelopes provided. Pay the hire fee and importantly write the details of your name,

membership number and fee on the envelope. Once complete, place the envelope through the brass letter box in the bar store door located behind the bar. See table below.

Please consult a member of the General Committee if you want to use a Club boat for the first time.

Please do not beach or drag club boats on the shore, this damages the hull. Do use the launching trailers to take boats out of the water or ask others to assist you in lifting a boat. Do drop or furl the sails when not in use, do not leave the sails flapping. Do roll sails to avoid creasing them (ask for help if you don't know how to store sails). Please look after our boats!

Optimists: There are many Club Optimists and the sails, masts, rudder and dagger boards can be found in the garage. They are not dinghy specific so please use any. The Optimists are located in the compound to the left of the Club. A small trolley is provided to move it to the water. After use, return the dinghy to the compound and lock the gate.

Toppers: There are many Club Toppers and the sails, masts, rudder and dagger boards can be found in the garage. They are not dinghy specific so please use any. The Toppers are located on the rack to the left (away from the car park) of the Clubhouse. The Toppers can be launched from where they are stored.

Hartley H12: The H12 is the new generation of training boat, it is very stable, has a deep, roomy, comfortable cockpit, high boom, good head clearance and visibility, self-draining, easy reefed, easy to right—comes up with very little water. There are two H12s which are stored next to the Fireflies, all equipment is stored in the boats.

Fireflies: There are six Fireflies. Sails, masts, rudder and centre boards are in/on the dinghy. The Fireflies are stored on launching trolleys

and located alongside the lake to the left (away from the car park) of the Clubhouse. They can be launched from where they are stored.

Wayfarers: There are three Club Wayfarers and the sails, masts, rudder and centre boards are in/on the dinghy. They are located to the left (away from the car park) of the Clubhouse in front of the compound with the safety boats. They are stored on a launching trolley and can be launched from the slipway immediately in front of the Clubhouse. Once launched please return the launching trolley to the berth to leave access to the slipway free.

Lasers: There are two Club Lasers and the sails, masts, rudder and dagger boards are kept in the garage. They are located to the left (away from the car park) of the Clubhouse, one in the row alongside the lake and the second close to the container. They are stored on a launching trolley and can be launched from either slipway immediately in front of the Clubhouse.

Please leave the boats and equipment in the state that you would wish to find them. Please de-rig, return the rigs (if appropriate) to the garage, put the boat back and secure the cover (if appropriate).

What do I do if a piece of equipment is missing or breaks on a Club boat?

Alongside the hire Boat Hire Book is a book for boat repairs. Enter the necessary details in the book and then taking a tag from the wall in front of you, attach this to the boat or equipment in need of repair. The boat maintenance crew will ensure it is repaired. If you do not record the repair no one knows and it cannot be repaired.

Do I need a buoyancy aid?

YES – Buoyancy aids are compulsory for all on paddle boards, windsurfers, canoes, kayaks, rowing boats or dinghies when on either lake.

May I swim?

YES – You can swim in the designated area in the large lake in front of the tables and swings. Children under 16 swimming must be supervised.

Can I swim in the main lake in front of the Clubhouse outside of the designated area?

NO – You can only swim in the designated area.

Can I use a boat in the swimming area?

NO – Hard hulled craft, boards, canoes etc. are not allowed in the swimming area. Inflatable boats or inflatable canoes are allowed.

Can I swim on the Open Water Course?

YES – The small top lake is for the sole use of open water swimmers and human powered paddle craft. No engine powered, other than for weed cutting, or sailing vessels may use this lake. As with other water sports any member undertaking the activity of open water swimming must understand the risks inherent in this activity and be medically fit and competent to undertake it.

- No solo swimming, minimum of two people who must stay within 4 metres of each other.
- Bright coloured swim hat and swimming drag along (tow) float to be used by all swimmers.
- Only enter the water at the signed slipway.
- Mobile phone and safety kayak to be ready and available at the entry point.
- No swimming when under the influence of alcohol.
- Swimmers only enter the water and swim if it is within their capabilities.

Can I bring visitors to the Club?

YES – A member may invite not more than five persons which includes adults and children

("Guests") at any time to the Club premises. For the purpose of this rule, Family memberships count as one member. Members must sign their guests in by entering the names and addresses of their guests in the visitor's book and must pay the fee as stated in the visitor's book. The member is personally responsible for their guest(s) whilst they are on Club premises. A member may not invite any person who has been refused or expelled from membership without the prior consent of the General Committee

The maximum number of times that any one guest may visit the Club premises in any calendar year is three (3). A member wishing to invite more than five persons to the Club premises (Rule 64) or exceed the maximum numbers of visits per year (Rule 65) must request and receive the prior consent of the General Committee

Can I use a BBQ at the Club?

YES – You can use the Club provided fixed BBQ located under the canopy on the decking. Charcoal and lighters are not provided by the Club. You must clean up after use and dispose of the ash. Do not place hot ash in the bins. If you bring a disposable BBQ and use it on the grass area you must ensure it is raised clear of the grass to avoid a grass burn.

Can I bring dogs to the Club?

YES – However, no dogs (with the exception of assistance dogs) are allowed in the Clubhouse or on the patio area. All dogs around the Clubhouse, on the grassed area in front of the car park or within the boat parks must be on a lead. If your dog "unburdens" itself please ensure you pick up. You may walk your dog around the lake off the lead once clear of the Clubhouse, car and boat parks.
